

Key Elements of Literary Analysis

Academic writing is indeed a daunting task for some students. However, this process can be made interesting. The same can happen to you if you work on a few important aspects of academic writing where one is literary analysis.

Literary analysis is what gives you ideas of the content or piece you are analyzing and writing about. As a result, you find the process of writing easy and interesting because you have a clear idea of what to compose. Still, there are many cases in which students proceed with hiring **paper writing service** providers in order to get their literary analysis papers done. However, understanding the key elements of literary analysis can help you easily write your papers and essays yourself.

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Basically, literary analysis can be defined as the scrutinization of any text keeping in view its elements such as plot, theme, theory, tone, characters and settings. Sometimes, students write about the text in general or simply compose a summary of the text they are supposed to analyze. However, making such mistakes may cost you grades. It is because there is a huge difference between literary analysis and a summary and hence, both should be dealt with accordingly. In short, the following are the main elements of literary analysis.

1. **Theme**

The theme is one of the most important aspects of every literary piece. A theme is actually the message or messages that the author covers throughout the reading or piece. In other words, the theme of a literary piece of writing is what the author wants to convey to the reader and hence, it should be dealt with carefully.

Keep in mind, you can never compose a masterful literary analysis paper if you can effectively analyze the theme of a literary work. 2. **Plot**

The plot covers the main conflicts and points that have taken place throughout the story. Analyzing the plot allows the writer to easily compose the main ideas and events that occurred in the story. Expert writers/authors suggest students to thoroughly read the story as an in-depth analysis of the story can be done only if the one who analyzes the story fully understands the plot of the story.

Bear in mind, never give a skim read to any literary piece you ever analyze. It is because you doing so will lead you to miss important aspects of the story such as;

1. Important events in the story
2. The flow or order of the events in the story
3. Significance of the events' order to purpose of the story or literary piece

3. **Setting**

It cannot be denied that there is always something in every literary piece or story about a role shown in the story. Analyzing the setting of a literary piece or story helps recognize the location as well as changing of location and their importance to the general purpose of the piece.

Furthermore, deeply analyzing the setting of a story allows one to comprehend “does the author of the story intentionally bring forth any cultural or social content in order to aid their aim or purpose?” As a result, one becomes able to easily and effectively analyze and comprehend the story accordingly.

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4. **Characters**

Characters are the roles that have taken place in the story. Effectively analyzing character development lets you know the facts about “how do characters have changed throughout the story?” This also helps comprehend the factors that have caused these changes.

5. **Point of View**

Point of view involves the claim or argument of the author about the story or topic they want to convey to the reader. Keep in mind, you can write a masterful literary analysis essay or paper if you fully comprehend the author's point of view while considering your own analyses and viewpoint.

To clearly get the author's point of view, make sure to comprehend the following things.

1. Why does the author prefer to write from this perspective?
2. What does this particular perspective add to the main story?
3. What does this particular perspective take to the main story?
4. Style

Style is what covers the format of the story and the way it affects the overall story or literary piece. In other words, always make sure to comprehend “how does the specific format of the story or literary piece affect the story or literary piece?” An effective analysis of style helps understand the role of word choice in the interpretation of the story or piece.

7. **Figurative Language**

Last but a highly important element of literary analysis is figurative language. Analyzing figurative language helps comprehend how and where symbols and metaphors have been used in the story. It also helps understand the key purpose of symbols and metaphors in the story or the overall fictionality of the story.

Moreover, clearly understanding the figurative language of a literary piece or story enables one to understand the reasons behind the selection of a particular figurative language in the piece or story.
